6 / Ski Dubai



3 / Kartdrome

Featuring 17-turns, a tunnel and a bridge, the exciting track hosts arrive and drive sessions daily. There is also a 620m indoor circuit aimed at younger drivers (aged 7+).



9 / Ferrari World Abu Dhabi

Just an hour's drive from Dubai is the home of the world's fastest rollercoaster – Ferrari World. The world's first Ferrari-themed park also features the highest loop ride, the tallest space-frame structure ever built on the planet and over 40 record-breaking attractions.

10 / Gold Souk

When you're visiting the "City of Gold" it's fitting to take a trip to this traditional market. Located in Dubai's commercial business district in Deira, the souk is home to over 380 retailers, most of whom are jewellery traders. Be sure to stop by to pick up a statement piece or special memento from your visit to Dubai, with prices that aren't set in stone.

Sal's Bistro ———— (S)

Overlooking the lake in the Jumeirah Islands Pavilion, this bistro serves a wide variety of cuisine in a picturesque, peaceful setting.

CARS Café ———— (S)

This automotive-focused community café is a great spot to grab breakfast, a light lunch or a coffee while on site given its welcoming atmosphere, motoring memorabilia and convenient location within the Dubai Autodrome paddock.

Gaia ———— (S) (S)

Le Petit Belge ———— (S)

Visa and Passport 🛂


Ensure that you have a valid passport with at least six months of validity from your intended departure date. Check the visa requirements for your nationality and obtain the necessary visa if required.

Currency 🇦🇪

The currency used in Dubai is the **UAE Dirham (AED)**. Exchange some currency at the airport or local banks, or use ATMs to withdraw cash. Credit cards are widely accepted.

Language 🌐

Whilst **Arabic** is the official language, **English** is commonly spoken and understood, especially in tourist areas. Signs and information are often in both languages.



Local Laws and Customs 🚫

- Dress modestly, especially when visiting religious sites or public places.
- Public displays of affection are strongly discouraged.
- Drinking alcohol in public places is not allowed.
- Don't drink alcohol if you're driving. The UAE has a zero-tolerance policy in place.
- Be respectful of local customs and cultures. As for permission before taking photos of people, especially in traditional areas.

Transportation 🚗

- Taxis and ride-sharing services are readily available.
- Renting a car is an option, but traffic can be challenging, and road rules are strictly enforced.



Weather 🌞

During the Gulf Historic, temperatures are expected to be around **25 to 30 degrees** Celsius maximum. There is a higher chance of rain, and flooding, in the region in December.

Shopping Hours 🛍️

Most shops and malls in Dubai open late in the morning until late in the evening (22h).

Tipping 🍷

Tipping is customary in Dubai. In restaurants, it's common to leave a **10-15% tip** if a service charge is not already included. Tipping is also appreciated by hotel staff and taxi drivers.

Apps to download 📱

Careem is your one-stop-shop when in Dubai. Covering a number of transport options (taxi, bike, car rental) in addition to food deliveries, groceries, tickets and salon treatments, it is highly recommended for making your trip as convenient as possible.

Safety 🛡️

Dubai is generally considered a **safe destination** for all visitors.

Emergency Numbers 📞

Memorise or save emergency contact numbers, including **999** (police), **998** (ambulance), and **997** (fire) for any unforeseen emergencies.

Electrical Outlets ⚡

Dubai uses the **Type G** electrical outlet with a voltage of 230V and a frequency of 50Hz (UK). Bring appropriate adapters and converters if necessary.
